

CCA continues to advocate on behalf of the conservation of our fishery resources and anglers' access to them. Many of our fisheries continue to be subjected to commercial overharvest while the resource itself and recreational fishing opportunities suffer.

It may sound a bit trivial, but I'm a big advocate of sticky, sharp hooks.

The EZE-LAP diamond hone is a importance tool in my opinion. They run about 7 bucks and available at Fisherman's Marine as well as other outdoor stores. I keep at least one in each of my boats and in every tackle box. Sometimes a hook needs a touch up to keep it sticky sharp. With todays pre-sharpened hooks, the old school yellow handled files take off too much metal and eat away at the long slender point. The EZE-LAP can either touch up or renew a dulled point. They can also touch up a dull pocket knife if needed. The EZE-LAP is a cheap investment that pays dividends.


